Financial aid: A grant or scholarship offered by the college for financial need. Includes grants offered in the fall semester who have applied for financial aid from the college for financial aid in the previous year. Also includes grants offered by the college to students before admission from high school).

Financial aid, financial aid (federal): A grant or scholarship offered by the college for financial need. Includes grants offered in the fall semester who have applied for financial aid in the previous year. Also includes grants offered by the college to students before admission from high school).

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Federal: A financial aid grant offered by the college for financial need.

***Federal aid:** Offered to students in beginning college. May be a fee for application fees, room and board fees, tuition fees, etc.

Federal aid (financial aid): A grant offered for 12 months of enrollment, 12 months of academic year, or 24 months consecutive each year.

General information (academic):

O ead i i: Admision policies which include all secondary school graduation requirements including GED and foreign diplomas accepted by the college.

O he e e (c): Includes age, gender, language, ethnicity, medical (if no admission fee), and family size.

O - f- ae ii: The admission changes between higher education institutions or admission fees.

Pa - i e de (deg ad a e): A dependent on tuition fees less than 12 credits per semester or a fee less than 24 credits per week each term.

***P e a c ei g**: One-on-one ongoing communication between professional and higher education personnel, educational, or vocational institutions.

P -bacca ea e ce ifica e: An individual having completed an organized program of study for 18 credits including the bachelor's degree, including foreign language, higher education, and academic degrees.

P - a e ce ifica e: An individual having completed an organized program of study for 24 credits including the master's degree, including the master's degree, and academic degrees.

P ec da a a d,ce ifica e, di a: Includes the following three IPEDS definitions for postsecondary, academic, and diploma of any duration and credit/concentration/degree.

Less Than 1 Academic Year: Requires completion of an organized program of study for less than one academic year (2 semesters or 3 quarters) or less than 900 credits.

S e e c a e da e : A calendar item has one or more dates indicating academic events throughout the year. There may be an additional meeting date.

S de -de ig ed a : A program offered based on individual interest, designed in accordance with the needs of students.

S d ab ad: An arrangement by which a student completes part of his college program during vacation. Can be a summer camp abroad or through a cooperative arrangement with another U.S. college or an institution abroad or at home.

***S e e i :** A meeting held at the beginning of each semester and no consideration of the academic year. It is the highlight of an institution operating on a time frame of months of an institution operating on a calendar year. The meeting may have more than one occurrence in the month. Some

Need-based aid: College-funded or college-administered aid from institutional, state, federal, or other source for which a student has financial need or qualifies. This includes both institutional and noninstitutional aid (grants, job, and loans).

Need-based scholarship aid: Scholarship and grants from institutional, state, federal, or other source for which a student has financial need or qualifies.

Need-based financial aid: Loan and job from institutional, state, federal, or other source for which a student demonstrates financial need or qualifies.

Non-need-based scholarship aid: Scholarship and grants, or merit-based aid from institutional, state, federal, or other source (including non-need-based grants and endowment income) awarded based on achievement, merit, or another non-need-based criterion. When reporting the amount H1 and H2, non-need-based aid has been combined with need-based aid.
